



Tobin Brothers Funerals 2024 ACT Khanacross Series Series Regulations

EVENT DETAILS

1. DEFINITION: Tobin Brothers Funerals ACT Khanacross Series (the Series) events will be conducted under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia and the Khanacross Standing Regulations, the Motorsport Australia Passenger in Vehicle Guidelines, the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Regulations, event supplementary regulations and any Further Regulations or Bulletins which may be issued.

The Series will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

2. PROMOTER: Light Car Club of Canberra (LCCC) - www.lightcarclub.org.au

3. EVENTS: The series will be contested over 8 rounds.

A Competitor's five (5) best event results and points will count if all eight (8) rounds of the Series are conducted. All results and points earned will count towards the Series if five (5) or fewer rounds are conducted.

- Round 1 - 10th Feb
- Round 2 - 24th March
- Round 3 - 11th May
- Round 4 - 23rd June
- Round 5 - 10th August
- Round 6 - 15th September
- Round 7 - 9th November
- Round 8 - 8th December

4. TYPE OF EVENT: **Club Khanacross**

5. VENUE: Canberra Greyhound Racing Club

We are thankful for the use of the grounds to host these events. A condition of the use of the grounds is that the LCCC maintain the surface and surrounding areas. Competitors must assist in undertaking course repairs and rock checks following each event and are highly encouraged to attend LCCC working bees. Without the use of these areas, these events would not take place.

Competitors are required to take their rubbish with them upon the conclusion of events.

6. SURFACE: Grass / Dirt (with some exposed rock base)

7. TESTS/COURSES: The number of tests will be advised for each round. These will be run in accordance with the **Motorsport Australia** Khanacross Regulations, and at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

A walk through of the tests may be conducted following the Driver's Briefing at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

8. COMPETITORS: Maximum number of competitors per Event: 40

Maximum entries per single vehicle: 3

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

9. EVENT TIMES Documentation and Scrutineering: 8:00am to 9:00am

Drivers Briefing: 9:30am to 9:45am

First car start time: 10:00am Last car finish time: Approximately 4:00pm

Post event site clean-up: Approximately 4:00pm

Payment will be required in full prior to commencement of the Event. Entries will be confirmed once payment is received. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.

All reasonable efforts will be made to run all Events. In the event of a cancellation, entry fees may be carried over to a later Event, however refunds may not be offered in the event of a cancellation.

DOCUMENTATION

11. LICENCE A valid **Motorsport Australia** Speed/Speed Junior Licence (or superior) must be presented at a documentation check.
12. CLUB MEMBERSHIP Valid membership to a **Motorsport Australia** affiliated car club (current membership card or copy of an online membership renewal receipt) must be presented during documentation.

You can join the LCCC online at www.lightcarclub.org.au. Annual membership or day membership will also be available for purchase on the day of each Event.

VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY/APPAREL

13. REGULATIONS All vehicles must comply with **Motorsport Australia** Khanacross Regulations, and with Schedule A and Group 4K of the **Motorsport Australia** Manual.

Approved helmets and apparel, must be in accordance with Schedule D of the **Motorsport Australia** Manual. Competitors should consult the Scrutineer with any queries.

Note electric and hybrid vehicles are not accepted.

14. EXHAUST NOISE All vehicles must be adequately muffled.
15. LOG BOOK If issued to a competition vehicle, a **Motorsport Australia** Vehicle Log Book must be presented at documentation.
16. LCCC CLUB CARS The LCCC has a range of club cars available for use by Junior/Rookie competitors and first time/novice Adult competitors, according to the conditions below:
- a. Club car hire fees are \$20 per event for juniors and \$40 per event for rookies and adults. Rookie and adult entrant hire is limited to 3 events.
 - b. Club car bookings must be made 7 days prior to the Event.
 - c. Club cars are allocated to competitors at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
 - d. Competitors are reminded that the club cars are provided in Good faith, and therefore these are to be driven accordingly. The Clerk of the Course retains the right to deny/retract use of Club vehicles as necessary.
 - e. Club cars are provided to get people started in the sport – it is expected that as competitors get more involved, and older, they will then use their own vehicles.
 - f. Anyone hiring a club car is expected to be on site must be on site from 8am on the day of the Event to:
 - i. assist in setting up a 'service area' for club cars;
 - ii. assist in preparing the club cars for competition; and
 - iii. be present for a scrutineering check of club cars.
 - g. During the day entrants using a club car are expected to:
 - i. assist with timekeeping when they are not competing in the club cars;
 - ii. ensure tests are completed in an efficient manner when sharing cars (ie. one to queue early, then do efficient driver changes between runs); and
 - iii. promptly seek assistance to rectify any issue with a club car.
 - h. At the end of the day entrants who have used a club car are expected to:
 - i. remove number stickers and any rubbish/paperwork from the car; and
 - ii. assist in assessing and preparing the club cars for the next event.
 - i. If a club car breaks down or is otherwise unable to continue in an Event, it will be considered that the vehicle and it's drivers have failed to finish in that Event unless the otherwise determined by an LCCC representative.

17. PASSENGERS This Event will have Instructors in vehicles **for new or junior competitors only**. If competing the passenger must undertake their test run prior to participating on that test as a passenger.
An instructor can be anyone over 18 years old, who holds a full driver's licence, a Motorsport Australia competition licence or a Motorsport Australia Coaches Licence.

CLASSES

18. 4WD Class: Open to 4WD vehicles, which are fitted with road tyres only.
19. 2WD Class: Open to 2WD vehicles, which are fitted with road tyres only.
20. Buggy Class Open to Buggy vehicles (4K vehicles) - Buggies will not be eligible for outright event or series awards.

21. Eligibility All 4wd and 2wd class vehicles must be fitted with road tyres. Tyres marked with all terrain, A/T, mud terrain, M/T, for off road use, for competition use or studded tyres are not suitable.
Vehicle eligibility for each class is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

CATEGORIES

22. Outright category Open to all Competitors including those specified below
23. Junior category Open to Competitors from 12 years to 16 years, inclusive
24. Rookie category Open to Competitors from 17 years to 20 years, inclusive
25. Female category Open to female Competitors only
26. Senior category Open to Competitors aged over 50 years
27. Eligibility Competitor eligibility for each class is at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course

AWARDS & PRIZE MONEY

28. Trophies will be presented for the following categories at the following event (where entries are received):

29. Competitors will accrue points at each event which will be tallied towards awards for the Series:

30. Further prizes or trophies may be awarded at the discretion of the Event Organisers.

POINTSCORING

31. Points for the Series will be allocated based on outright placings as follows:
1st – 15 points, 2nd – 14 points, 3rd – 13 points, and so on to 15th place – 1 point
32. Points for the Series will be allocated based on category placings as follows:
1st – 10 points, 2nd – 9 points, 3rd – 8 points, and so on to 10th place – 1 point
33. If Competitors tie at a round, the total points for the highest place they have collectively filled shall be equally shared among them.
34. If at the end of the Series, two or more Competitors have an equal number of points, a result will be determined by a count back of outright places at each event. If Competitors still tie after a count back of results, they will be declared equal status for the purpose of awards.
35. To be eligible for series points a competitor must have assisted in the running of the by either assisting in pack up / pack down, undertaking timing, points scores, BBQ or other tasks as approved by the LCCC Committee.

TIMING AND PENALTIES

36. Timing will be by hand held stop watches. Two watches per test operated by different officials, with one watch to be a master and the other as a backup. Timing shall be to 0.01 of a second and recorded as such.
37. Penalties shall be applied as per the Motorsport Australia Khanacross Regulations available at www.motorsport.org.au.
38. Timekeepers will be considered Judges of Fact for the application of penalties. Any enquiries relating to the application of penalties should be raised with the Clerk of Course in the first instance.

MISCELLANEA

39. Competition numbers shall be allocated at the discretion of the event organisers. It is important that non-competing drivers in shared vehicles place a strip of tape through their numbers if not undertaking a test to assist timekeepers to correctly identify the driver in the car.
40. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.
41. The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.
42. Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

INTEGRITY

43. Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy, Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au.
Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.
Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.
Smoking - Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.
